Nursery

In Nursery this week we have been learning our new class story 'Mrs mole, I'm home!', the children have enjoyed listening and creating actions to re-tell the story. In maths we have been sequencing events such as, planting a seed and brushing our teeth. In phonics we have been working hard to recognise the grapheme 't', we have practised forming the letter. Our nursery rhyme of the week is 'Two little dicky birds'.

Reception

This week in Reception we began exploring our new text 'Handa's Surprise'. We began by learning about Africa and the differences between Africa and where we live. We listened to African music and tasted some of the exotic fruits in the story. In Maths we have been looking and odd and even sharing and if groups are equal. In phonics we have begun learning Phase 5 sounds, which is our final phase of Reception! This week we have learnt the sounds 'ay, ou, ie and ea'. Please support your children in practising these sounds at home.

Year 1

In Year 1 this week we had a tiny magical door appear in our classroom! We have been talking and writing about where it might lead to. In maths we have been reviewing place value to 50 to get us ready for moving on to 100 - counting practice at home will really help us to make sure we are ready to work with even bigger numbers! In art and geography we began our new topic looking at Kenya and why water is so important.

Year 2

This week Year 2 have begun learning about Victorian trains. There were some great conversations across the two classrooms as we compared pictures of trains, carriages and wagons. In Art lessons, we compared the work of Claude Monet and William Powell Frith.

Year 3

In year 3 this week we have completed our information texts about our Greenhouse Creatures and done really well. We are learning to tell the time in maths so it would really help if you can support with this at home too. We have been learning how pyramids are built in our history lessons.

Year 4

This week we have been looking at animal classification and how animals can be grouped. We have been identifying features of birds, reptiles, fish, mammals and amphibians. In writing we have been investigating the Serlby Park Half-term Hauntings by interviewing key witnesses and writing up their recounts.

Safeguarding

Releasing in January 2024, Palworld took the gaming scene by storm, selling over five million copies in just three days. A new take on the survival genre – blending mechanics similar to games like Minecraft with the ability to catch and fight alongside creatures reminiscent of Pokémon – it saw plenty of coverage from games journalists and influencers alike.

However, despite its lower age rating and popularity with young gamers, Palworld has been criticised for its reliance on shock humour – touching on topics including animal abuse and sweatshop labour – and as a game featuring online multiplayer, one can expect certain safety concerns to arise.
