### Nursery

In Nursery this week, we have been imagining we are in Antarctica and describing the setting that Mr Mole visits when he meets the penguins. In maths, we have been learning about the composition of 4 and exploring this using numicon. In phonics, we have been working hard when forming the letter 'P' and listing objects that begin with the initial sound 'p'. Can you find anything around the house beginning with 'p'?

### Reception

In reception, we have been continuing to learn new graphemes in phase 5 (oy, ir, ue and aw). The children have been engaged with discussions as to how similar these graphemes are to others taught in phase 3. In TFW, we have been learning all about the story 'Handa's Surprise' and beginning to retell the text using actions. Each class has continued to enjoy learning about Africa and differences between our community and theirs. In Maths, we have been learning all about patterns. We have learned to identify the units within patterns, making them precise to ensure no mistakes are made. For example, The pattern in 'one stick and two stones'.

### Year 1

This week, Year 1 have all worked incredibly hard during Phonics Screening week. They all tried their absolute best and blew us away - well done Year 1! In geography, we have enjoyed continuing to learn about the weather in Kenya and we have been learning about what worship means to different people in RE.

### Year 2

This week has been very busy in Year 2. We have begun to story map our new text, Pirate Tom in writing lessons. Also, we have been writing using different sentence openers to make our writing more interesting. In Maths, we have explored tally charts and have continued to build on new knowledge learned, including 5 being represented by four vertical lines with a diagonal line through the four. We continued to learn about how and why trains are important to where we live, including comparing modern trains and Victorian trains. Some of our Year 2 children have taken the Phonics screening check - well done to those that took part. We are so proud of you!

### Year 3

In year 3 this week, we have started to learn about character flaws in writing. In maths, we are still practising telling the time. Our science lessons have been all about friction and we have completed our unit of Healthy Me in jigsaw lessons.

### Year 4

This week, Y4 have completed their MTC tests and have done an amazing job - they have put a lot of effort in and tried their best! In RE, we have been furthering our understanding of pilgrimages and looking specifically at the Hindu pilgrimage to the River Ganges. In computing, we have been learning about program inputs and outputs, going on to design our own device that requires an instruction for an outcome.

#### **FAIR PLAY AND FRIENDLY COMPETITION**

### Year 5

In Maths, the children are looking at decimals and understanding how to accurately add and subtract decimals to different decimal places. In Topic, we have looked at the Roundheads and the Cavaliers and the impact that the civil war had on Democracy in the country.

### Year 6

In year 6 this week, we have started our new unit in science. We looked at how the Earth has changed over millions of years and how this led to the extinction of certain species of animals throughout history. In writing, we finished a moving piece of writing about the picture book, 'The Arrival' where we retold the story of a man leaving his family behind while he travels.
