The children have also been working hard to develop their mark making and fine motor skills during Christmas themed activities and crafts. We enjoyed having our grown ups come to visit us and taking part in our stay and play. Our nursery rhyme of the week is 'Tommy thumb'.

## **Reception**

This week in Reception we have been working hard retelling The Christmas Story ready for our Christmas performance. The children are very excited. We have been learning a non-fiction text about owls, describing the features of an owl and labelling pictures of owls.

# <u>Year 1</u>

This week in Year 1 we have been innovating our own recount based on the story of The Three Little Pigs. We have begun working with numbers up to 50 in maths, and really enjoyed experimenting with attaching axles to a chassis in DT. We have also been working hard learning our songs for our Christmas Production and look forward to seeing some of you in the audience!

## <u>Year 2</u>

This week year 2 have been artists using charcoal and a range of techniques to create different tones and shades. We have practiced using our fingers to smudge, ink pens to add detail and used pressure to experiment with lighter and darker tones. We have engaged in heated debates in writing on a range of different topics all in preparation to write a discussion text all about whether children should have to wear school uniform. Finally, we have practiced our songs and nativity ready for our performance next week!



# <u>Year 3</u>

Year 3 have been continuing with our instruction writing, focusing on using bullet points and time adverbials. In maths, we have been applying our learning of division to formal written methods. We have almost finished our science learning for this half term looking at nutrition and good food choices.

## <u>Year 5</u>

This week Year 5 have been arts and crafty! We have explored the art of printing using overlaying. We also sketched some designs of Mount Vesuvius, thinking about which we would like to appear on our final designs. In maths we have been using the grid method to multiply numbers including 3 and 4- digit numbers multiplied by 2-digit numbers. What an amazingly busy week.

## <u>Year 4</u>

In Year 4, we are coming to the end of our topics. In science we have looked at the digestion system and how food is broken down by the body. In history, we have answered our overarching learning question 'Were the Vikings really vicious?' However, the biggest news in Year 4 was the outrageous theft of Mrs Kent's Christmas tree. We became CSI Serlby and discovered, through careful questioning and fingerprinting, that the culprit was none other than Mr Goodman!
